

Denton County: Growth 2010 to 2024










Denton County: At Risk Populations

ALICE and Poverty households combined in 2023 total **112,032** in Denton County.

2022 to 2023 Poverty households dropped 6,790 and ALICE increased 5,373.



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



Denton County Point-in-Time Count Survey Areas












Individuals experiencing chronic homelessness. They have at least 1 condition and have been unhoused at least a year.









*Denton County's Housing Priority List is comprised of adults only








When children are removed from the 2025 PIT Count, the adult total closely matches the January 2025 HPL.

This is because the HPL only includes adults who've been assessed and are actively engaged in services. Children are counted in the PIT but not listed individually on the HPL.


