

Denton County continues to be one of the fastest-growing communities in the country while uniquely located adjacent to two major metropolitan areas.









ALICE SURVIVAL WAGE

A family of four with two working adults must make a combined total of **\$34.37/hour or \$71,508/year to survive in Denton County**. If those children need childcare, the adults must earn at least **\$38.46/hour or \$80,004/year**.



COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT – ALICE



42% of Black and 38% of Hispanic households earn below the ALICE Survival Wage in Denton County. While both races have similar poverty-level households, their ALICE household percentage is nearly double those of White and Asian households. Households with 2 or more races also have a high percentage increase in ALICE households compared to White and Asian households.



Nearly 7 of 10 foster care children are placed OUTSIDE of Denton County due to a lack of placement options. There were 326 children in foster care in Denton County and 15 adoptive homes within the county available for placement. (Texas Department of Family and Protective Services, 2021)






66% of all Denton County economically disadvantaged students are in Denton ISD and Lewisville ISD.

PERCENTAGE OF ALL THIRD GRADERS READING AT GRADE LEVEL: DENTON COUNTY VS. STATE




Third-grade reading scores are predictive of both graduation and incarceration rates. Both locally and statewide, the proportion of third-graders reading at grade level is falling.






COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT – CHILDREN & FAMILIES

Abuse and Neglect Investigation Totals from DPS




MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDER TO PERSON RATIO


